NEW?

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- Unexcused Absences: Missing more than 2 events or outings, during 1 academic school year
- Excused Absences: Missing more than 4 events or outings, during 1 academic school year
- Late Notice: Cancelling within 24 hours of an event will result in an unexcused absence

#### DID YOU KNOW A DEGREE CAN HELP YOU EARN MORE OVER A LIFETIME?

- Someone with a high school diploma can expect to earn \$1.3 million.
- A worker with some college but no degree earns \$1.5 million.
- An Associate's degree-holder earns \$1.7 million.
- A worker with a Bachelor's degree will earn \$2.3 million.
- Graduate degrees provide for even higher earnings:
  - A Master's degree-holder earns \$2.7 million.
  - A Doctoral degree-holder earns \$3.3 million.
  - A Professional degree-holder earns \$3.6 million.

## 10 Tips for Crafting an Outstanding College Essay

Start Early: Give yourself plenty of time to brainstorm, write, and revise. Starting early reduces stress and improves the quality of your essay.

- Understand the Prompt: Carefully read the essay prompt and ensure your response directly addresses the question or theme.
- Show, Don't Tell: Use vivid anecdotes and specific examples to illustrate your points. This makes your story more engaging and memorable.
- Be Authentic: Write in your own voice and be honest about your experiences and perspectives. Authenticity resonates more with readers than a polished but impersonal essay.
- Focus on Your Unique Qualities: Highlight what makes you stand out. Share personal stories or insights that reflect your individual strengths and experiences.
- Create a Strong Opening: Grab the reader's attention with a compelling introduction. A memorable opening can set the tone for the rest of your essay.
- Stay Organized: Structure your essay logically with a clear introduction, body, and conclusion. Ensure each paragraph flows smoothly into the next.
- Reflect on Growth: Demonstrate how your experiences have shaped who you are today. Colleges appreciate seeing personal growth and self-awareness.
- Edit Ruthlessly: Revise your essay multiple times to refine your language, fix grammatical errors, and improve clarity. Consider seeking feedback from teachers, mentors, or peers.
- Follow Guidelines: Adhere to word limits, formatting requirements, and submission deadlines. Following instructions shows attention to detail and respect for the process.

# Tips for Recommendations

A letter of recommendation for a college or scholarship is a written endorsement from a teacher, counselor, or mentor that highlights a student's academic achievements, personal qualities, and suitability for the program. It provides insights into the student's character and accomplishments, offering specific examples to support their application. This letter helps admissions committees or scholarship panels understand the student's potential beyond grades and test scores. Essentially, it reinforces the student's qualifications and fit for the college or scholarship opportunity.

#### TIPS FOR REQUESTING A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Choose Wisely:
  - Pick someone who knows you well, like a teacher or mentor, who can speak to your strengths and character. (Remember you have Elevated Mentors who can write your letter!)

#### 2. Provide Information:

- Share a resume or list of achievements and your personal statement to help them write a detailed letter.
- 3. Request Early:
  - Ask for the letter well in advance and be clear about deadlines and requirements.
- 4.Be Polite:
  - Make your request formally and follow up respectfully. Always thank them for their support.
- 5. Check and Proofread:
  - Ensure the letter is submitted correctly and encourage your recommender to proofread it.

Following these steps can help ensure your recommendation letters enhance your college application!
